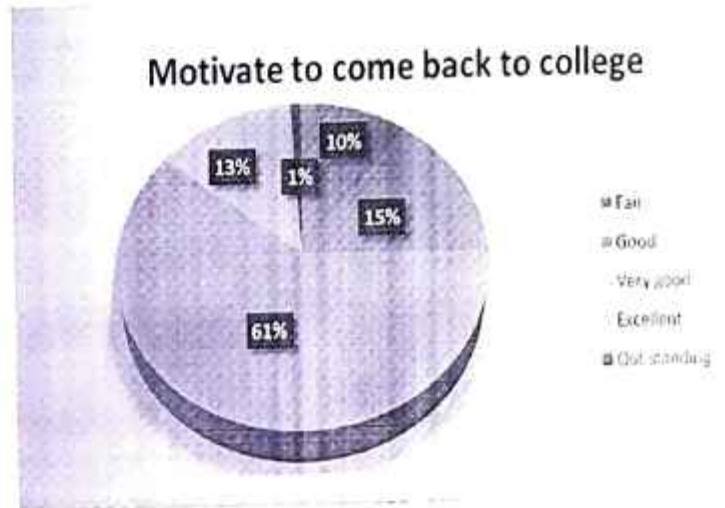

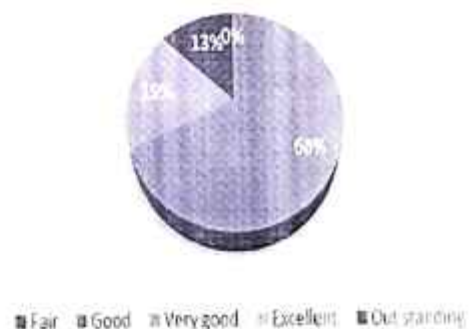

### Clarity of expectation form the alumni

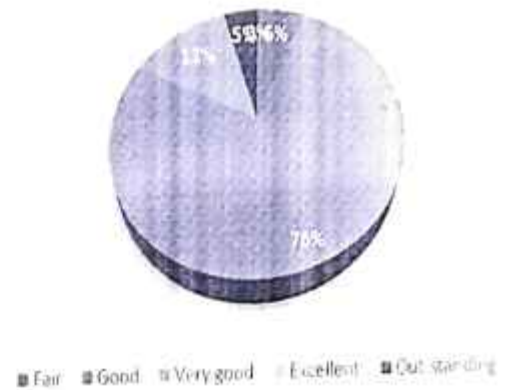

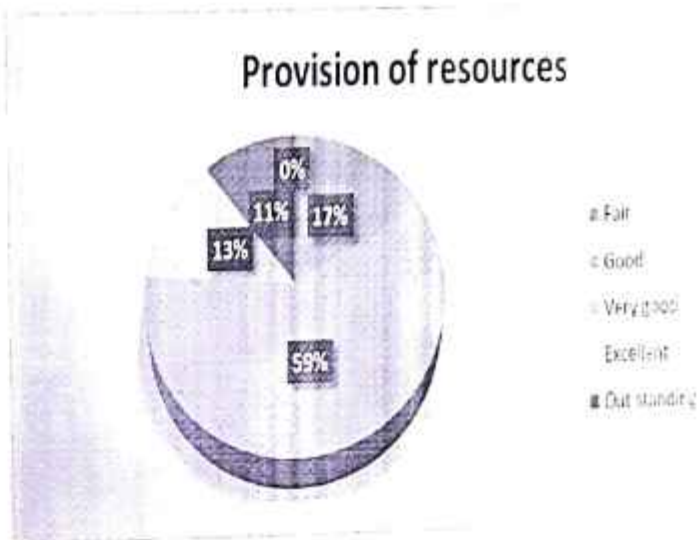

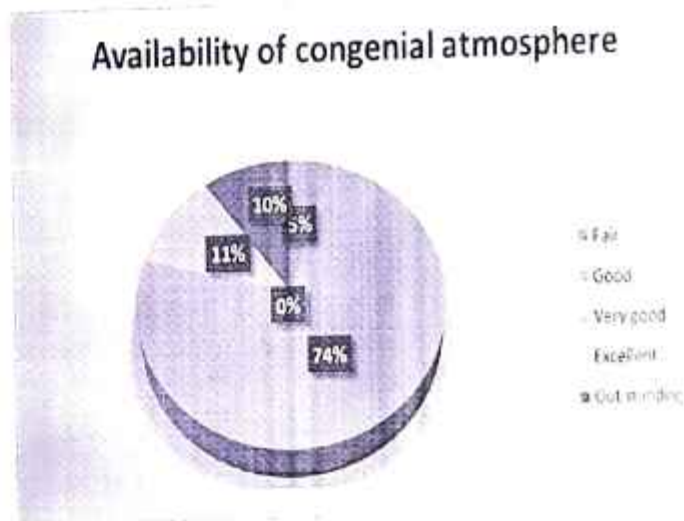

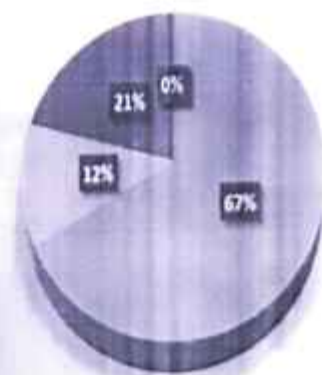

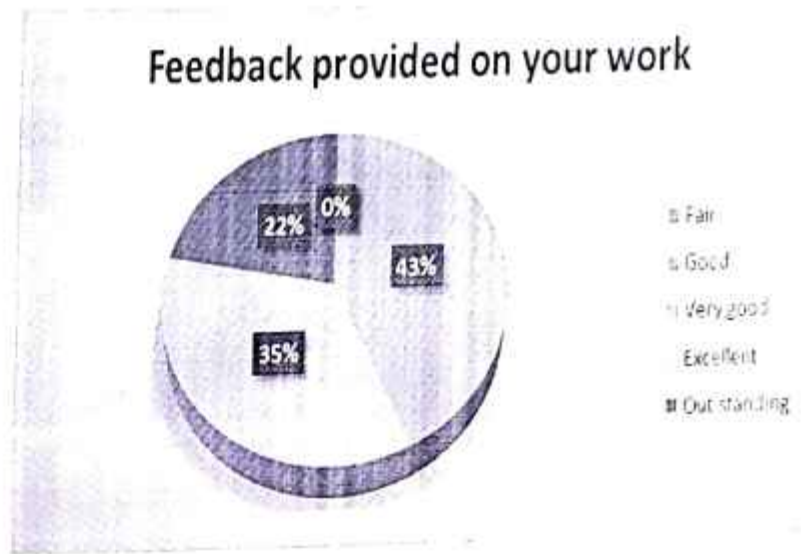

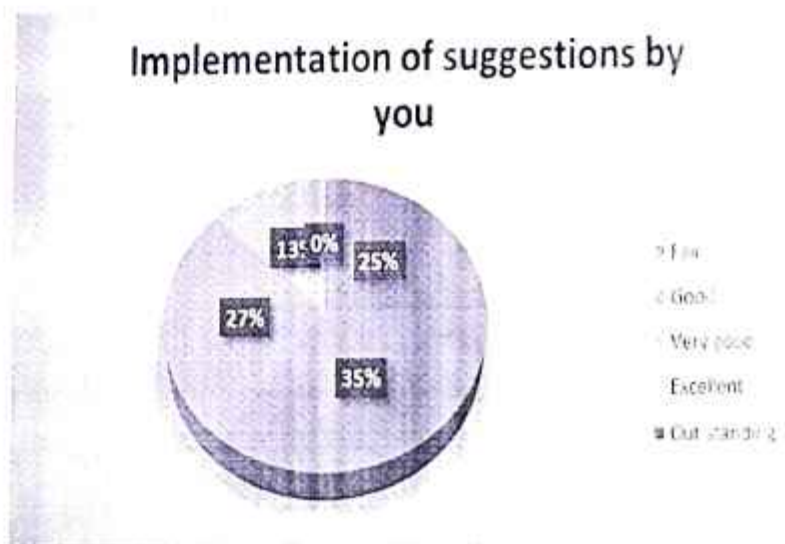

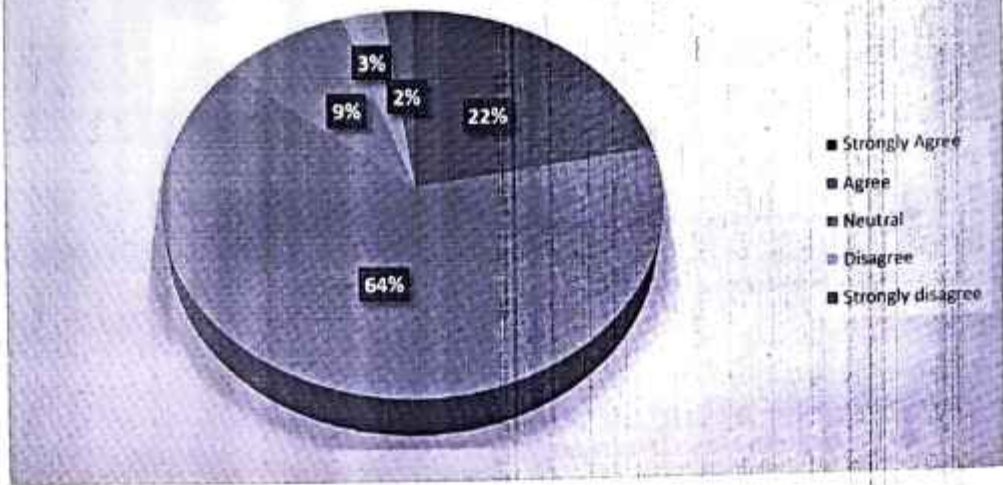

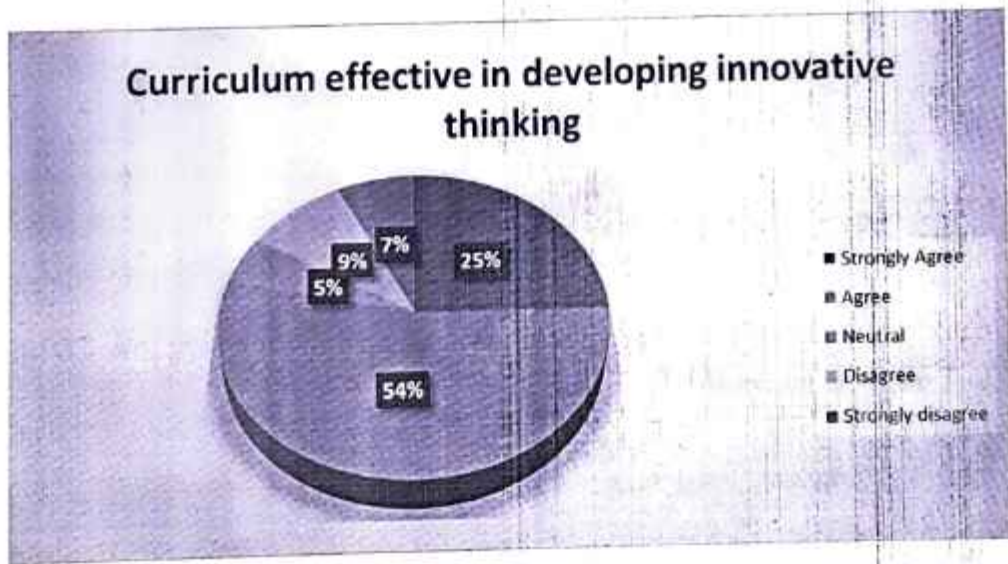


### Curriculum relevant for employability



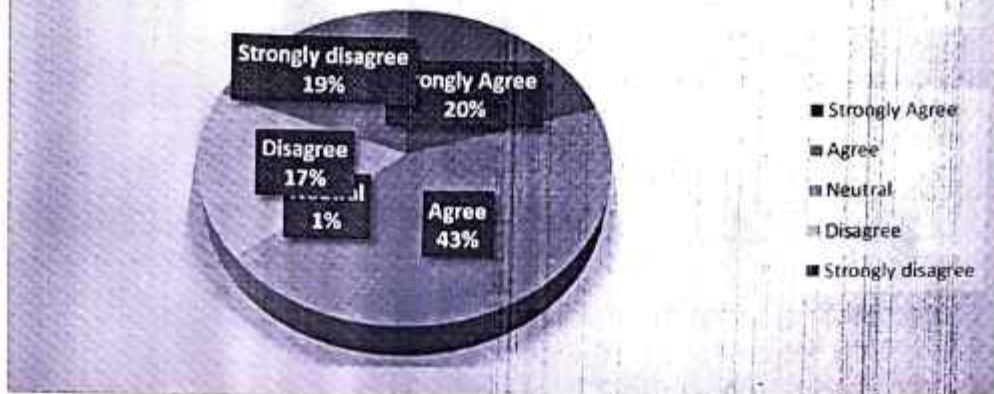
