The year was indeed a vivacious, fantabulous one and brought with itself, moments of pride and a sense of accomplishments. What a Year it was!



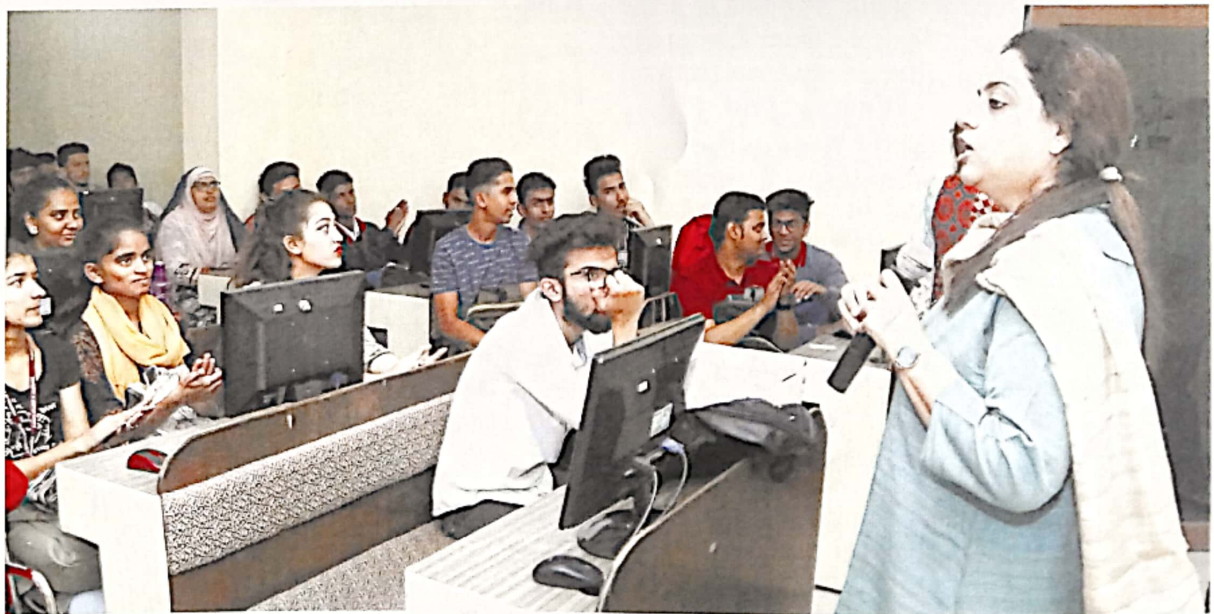
Women Development Cell (WDC)

Women Development Cell at Clara's College is an initiative to work towards empowering women in every aspect of their lives and in this endeavor, there are numerous programmes, workshops and seminars organized under its wing.

Year 2019 witnessed a series of such endeavors by the cell. It all began in the month of February. Violence and other crimes against women are prevalent in our society, despite numerous efforts from the law enforcement divisions of our nation. An **'Expert Talk on Women's Rights'** organized under the wing of Women Development Cell of the college in February aimed at raising an awareness about women's rights in the budding young females. The programme was focused on crime against women, their marginality in the society and their legal rights and approaches used to end such crimes. It witnessed the participation of over 80 students who were addressed by Advocate Nausheen Yusuf, a lawyer and a Programme Manager at Majilis Legal Center.

With her factual oration, she created awareness amongst the students about various crimes like foeticide, rape, kidnapping, etc. faced by women in rural and urban India. With the examples of Nirbhaya and Vishakha V/s State of Rajasthan cases, students got a deeper insight into the matter.

Trailed in March was a session on **'Stress Management'**. Contemporary lifestyle and keeping up with the speed of life creates enough stress in the mind, leading to numerous ailments. It is important to learn to manage it and lead a healthy life. Professor Anita Singh, a recognized expert in Clinical Psychology, enlightened our female students and their mothers on the subject. Around 40 students from B.Com., BMS, BAF and BMM participated in the session which was quite successful. Furthermore, July saw an ardent participation of 110 students from degree college in a session on **'Quest for Women Safety and Security'**. The speaker Mrs. Maya Gawde, the Sub-Inspector at Versova Police Station shared her insights about women safety in public places, gender sensitization, social media influences and its impact on women's safety and how to avoid

/tackle such issues. The informative session concluded with a Q& A session and a vote of thanks by Advocate Minal Sharma.

The session was attended by over 75 students and was quite informative. The zealous year concluded in October with a 3-day **'Self Defence Training'** workshop for the female students of our college, wherein, Mr. Sharif Babu, the President & Technical Director of Academy of Self Defence emphasized on its importance and raising awareness on self defence for women, the techniques and how to avoid difficult situations. Over 161 girl students from degree college participated in this interactive workshop and learnt about self defence techniques.

With such empowering interactions and sessions, Women Development Cell indeed made its mark and made a difference in the lives of our girl students.



Whether it's knowledge enrichment or upgrading skills in different domain, interactive engagements play an intrinsic role in the process. IQAC capitalized on effectiveness of such experiential approach and with the objective of taking the educators, students and the institution to the next level, organized several such engagements in the form of seminars, workshops and training programmes.

The year commenced in June with a Faculty Enriching Programme for Teaching & Non-Teaching Staff wherein, a workshop on **'Image Enhancement'** enriched them with the knowledge on building and managing their image. Furthermore, in July, they were equipped with the Revised Guidelines of AQAR under NAAC through a workshop on **'NAAC Way Forward'**. The month also brought a



learning opportunity for students wherein, they got a chance to learn more about **'Framework for Data Collection and Analysis in Social Science Research'** in a one-day workshop organized under the wing of IQAC.

The fruitful session was wrapped up with insightful learnings and a vote of thanks to the organizers.



Came January and the journey of augmentation took up a new course. The learning account opened with a session of **'Right to Information Act'** which saw overwhelming interest of around 75 students from different sections of degree college. Mr. Robin Tauro, the eminent speaker, pursued the aim to orient and sensitize the students on RTI Act 2005 and went on to offer his knowledge on the subject. Students gained insights on the role and responsibilities of Public Information Officers (PIO) and Assistant Public Information Officers (APIO), the regulations and obligations involved.

The enlightening journey continued for students with an Expert Talk on **'Start Up India'**, wherein they got a view of startup projects in India, their norms and a way forward. It was then time to dive into the knowledge pool of wealth creation. And a session on **'Wealth Habits for Youth'** organized during the month served the purpose right. Their learning became stronger with yet another intervention – **'Financial Literacy Training Programme'** by Dr. Pruthviraj Desai which was conducted alongside. In the latter, students learnt about safe investments, responsible borrowing and various money scams that they should stay away from. The month also touched upon the

pressing issue of the digital world. In the Expert Talk on **'Awareness of Cyber Crime'** organized for the students and faculty members, Mr. Sachin Dhedia spoke on the legal provisions under IT ACT and the legitimate use of cyber space. He also discussed the cybercrime cases and enlightened them on procedure to follow in case of witnessing such crime or being victimized.

February was the month to add some prudence to knowledge on Indian economy and a session on **'GST and Impact of Budget 2019 on Indian Economy'** made the quest all fascinating. During the session, Mr. Mahendra Pratap Singh, a retired Indirect Tax Commissioner discussed various important matters related to GST Act, the Indirect Taxes Law, etc. March trailed along and started with a Faculty Development Program on **'NAAC Accreditation Process – A Tool for Quality Improvement'**. Later, it continued its edifying voyage with a seminar on **'Time Management for Effective Learning'** which was organized for the degree college students. The session was aimed at enabling students to understand the importance of effective time management and Mrs. Kavita Sasane, the speaker pursued it with narration of success stories. During the month, students also learnt about IPR in a seminar on **'Intellectual Property Rights'**. Advocate Hema Mehta addressed over 80 students and discussed about IPR and various issues and solutions pertaining to it. The month concluded with a session on **'Connecting Career with Life'** wherein, Ms. Kavita Sasane from Tata STRIVE spoke about its mission and building capability of youth for employability, entrepreneurship and community enterprise through meticulous training.

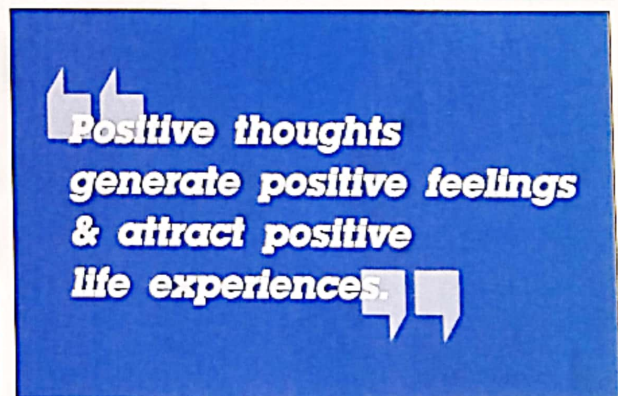
Youth Festival
