






Interpretation: Out of total responses there is repetition of feedback around 7.1 %



Interpretation: The responded are from all the classes including First year, second year and third year from all programs




Interpretation: Out of total responded 42.3% are female and 57.7% are male respondents.




Interpretation: The above graph show the result for the academic year 2021-2022.

Interpretation: Out of total respondents 98.8% from under graduate and from post graduate students are 1.2%


In which degree programme you are studying? 241 responses




Interpretation:

1. The syllabus covered in the class:




2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 241 responses


3. How well were the teachers able to deliver the content? 241 responses

241 responses




Interpretation:

5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers:



6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? 241 responses




Interpretation:

241 responses




Interpretation:

241 responses




Interpretation:

9. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes:



10. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you: 241 responses




Interpretation:

11. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications:






Interpretation:


12. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges: ²⁴¹ responses


13. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them: ²⁴¹ responses


14. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process: 241 responses

15. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences: 241 responses




Interpretation:

16. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities: ²⁴¹ responses




Interpretation:

241 responses




Interpretation:

18. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching:


