

Anti-Ragging

Ragging is one of the serious issues faced by the students of most of the educational institutions across India. 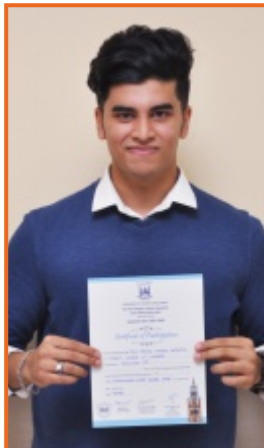
To wrap it up, NSS students had a great year through all the seasons, learning and contribute, serving and making a difference to the society.

Dr. Gholap addressed students and encouraged them to vote while Prof. Joshi spoke on behalf of the college and reiterated the importance of National Voters' Day.

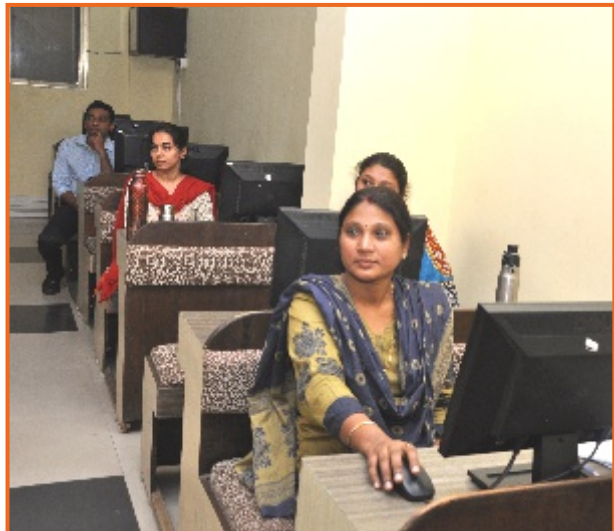




IQAC stands for Internal Quality Assurance Cell that acts as a facilitator and participative voluntary system/unit of the institution. It is proposed by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore that every accredited institution must establish IQAC as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure. The purpose of IQAC is implement the action plan to evaluate and assess performance and facilitate accreditation and quality upgradation of the institutions for higher education.

The primary objective of the cell is to build and align the system for conscious, consistent and catalytic progress in the overall performance of the institution and to promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices.

Besides, IQAC will provide a sound basis for decision making to improve institutional functioning and act as a dynamic system for quality changes in HEIs. It will also contribute to building an organized methodology of documentation and internal communication.



Workshops conducted by IQAC Committee

Workshops offer the perfect dais for students to explore the novel avenues and learn from them. 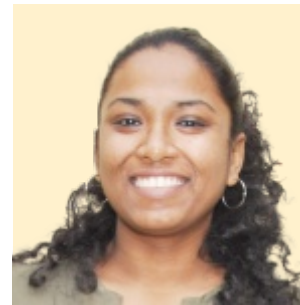

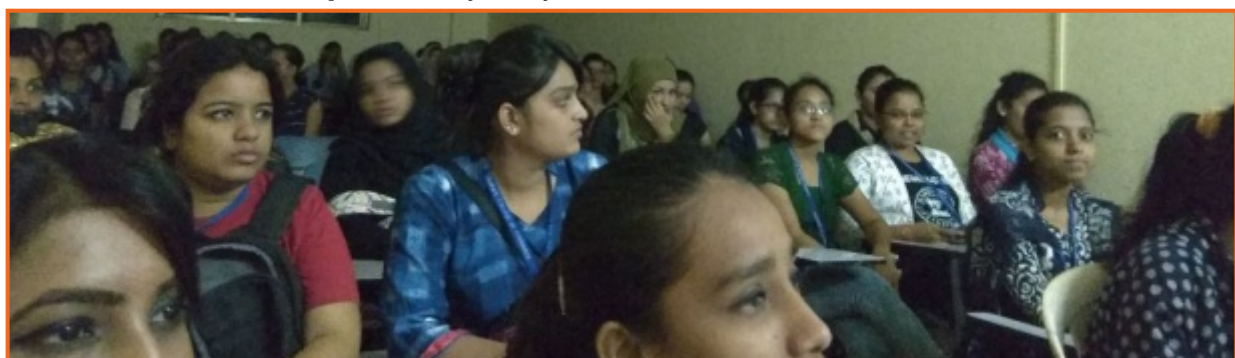

Welcomed by Dr. Geeta Balakrishnan, the Principal of Clara's College of Commerce, Dr. Vaidya addressed the students of B.Com, BMS, BMM & BAF and touched upon educational, work and health related issues faced by women. She also highlighted the importance of girl-child education and various schemes rolled out by the Government of India to facilitate the same. The lecture concluded with the Q & A session followed by group song performance by WDC student members.



Acknowledging and appreciating the success is an important aspect of empowerment. And the Poster Making Competition held by Women Development Cell of Clara's College of Commerce on 11th of December served the very purpose. The theme of the competition was 'Your Ability Counts, Gender Doesn't!'. Students from B.COM, BMS, BAF & BMM enthusiastically participated in the contest. Mrs. Sunaina Patil from Children Welfare Centre High School judged the competition based on

relevance of the theme, presentation, creativity and the colour harmony of the poster and collage. Winners were awarded with the prizes and even participation certificates were distributed. It was a fun-filled event that allowed students to explore and learn about women achievers who made their mark in different fields despite faced by many adversities.



Industrial Visit (BAF, BMS, BMM)

Industrial visits offer a wider scope of experiential learning for students. They allow them to explore the process and understand the real-time working of the same. Comprehending the importance, Clara's College of Commerce had planned various industrial visits for our BMM, BMS and BAF students in the month of January.

Around 90 students from BAF section got an opportunity to visit the factory of Sudhir Energy Pvt. Ltd. in Dadra. The company is known for setting up diesel based captive power plants up to 20MW and stands tall as a leader in the Indian Power Generation Sector. Accompanied by Mr. Vijaykumar Makwana, Ms. Ruchita Pandhare, Mr. Shahid Ansari and Mrs. Dr. Mamta Rajni, students were given a tour of the factory and explained the manufacturing process by the factory floor manager.

90 students from BMS as well visited Euro Décor Pvt. Ltd. factory in Dadra under the guidance of Asst. Prof. Amit Ashok Banod, Asst. Prof. Poonam Lad, Asst. Prof. Reena Dave and Asst. Prof. S. Chaudhary. Post receiving the brief on rules and guidelines, they were directed to the seminar hall. Furthermore, the factory floor manager shared information on the manufacturing process with them wherein they learnt about the raw material, Veneer Making and forming of plywood sheets.

Later, they also paid a visit to Stonemann Royale Ltd. (SRL) where they got a tour of the marble and granite processing unit. The factory manager explained the process of cutting and polishing the marble using CNC technology.

As for BMM section, about 49 students got to visit Sakal Times Newspaper Printing Press under the direction of Prof. Faisal Tanwar and Prof. Vidushi. They learnt about press machineries, the printing process, editing and various stages the newspaper must go through before it gets printed.

Later they also visited the National Film Archive of India, a media unit established by Ministry of Information and Broadcasting. It is a huge repository of over 10000 films, 10000 books, 10000 film scripts and over 50000 photographs.



Cultural Events

Cultural events inspire and facilitate wholistic learning and development of one's persona. With an objective of providing such a ground to students, Clara's College of Commerce organized various events all round the year.

The account opened with an Essay Writing Competition in English, Hindi, Marathi and Urdu language which was held on 23rd of January in the Hall Library. About 43 students from different sections keenly participated in the competition that offered them an opportunity to explore ideas and perspectives on different topics and express them creatively.

Followed next on the 27th of the same month was the Talent Hunt Competition in which about 38 students participated in various creative contests viz. 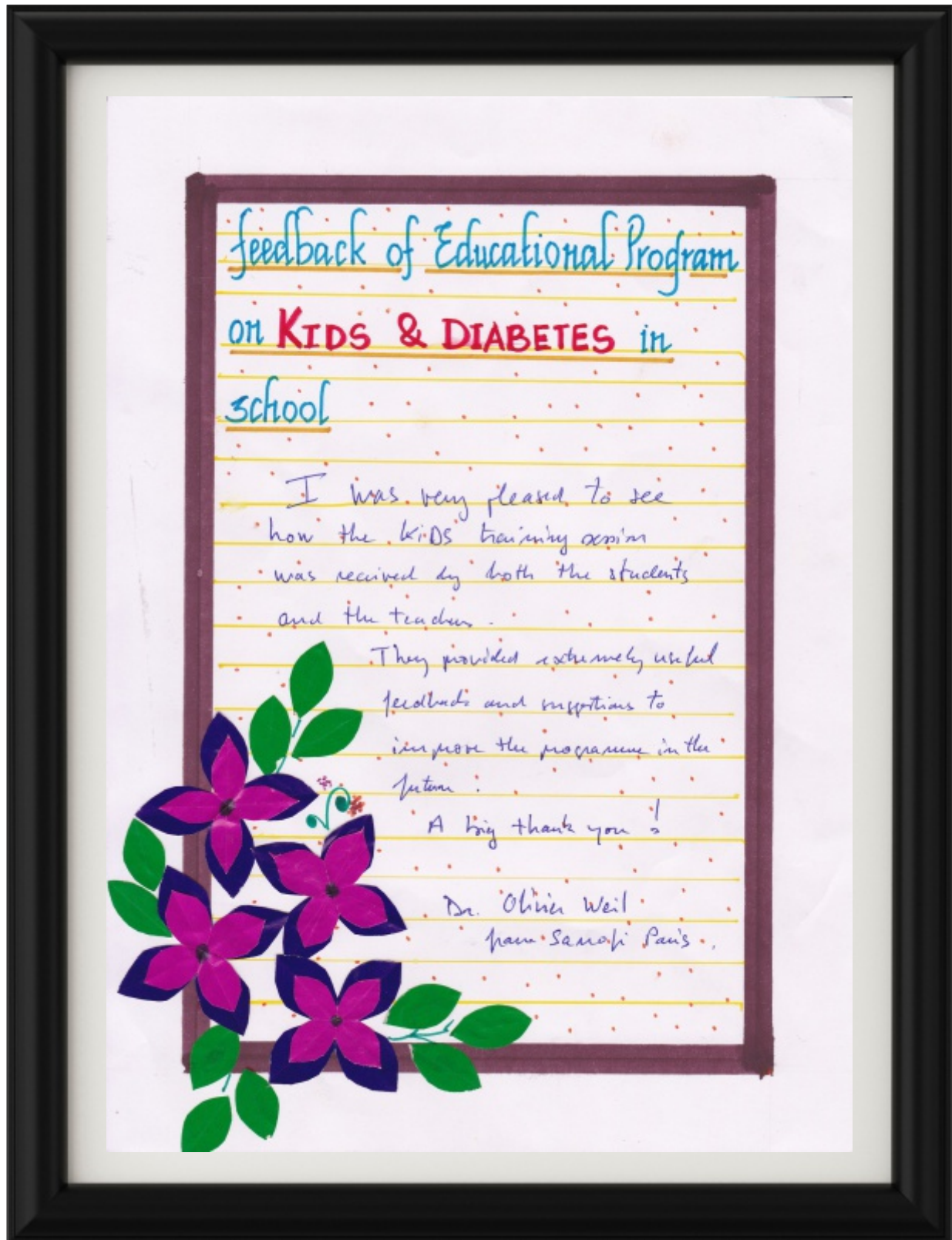

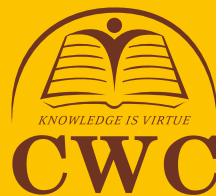
